

Student Council - Representing Every Voice

Our Student Council has continued to do a fantastic job this academic year, ensuring that every student's voice is heard. Committed to upholding our core values of honesty, respect, and compassion, the council carefully reviews all feedback submitted through the Student Communication Form.

They promote transparency by regularly updating the student body on their discussions and actions. This is done through the weekly Student Bulletin, which is emailed to all students, and highlighted in Mr. Baines' morning briefings.

Their dedication is helping to build a stronger, more inclusive school community where all students feel valued and heard. Our head students, King and Summer, then meet with the Senior Leadership Team once a term to update them on the student voice and the actions they have taken. For example, our Anti-bullying Ambassadors have created a video that was shared with all Year 7 to Year 11 tutor groups with details on how to use our online portal to report any bullying concerns.

Building Character Through Weekly Lessons

Each week, students take part in a dedicated one-hour lesson focused on character development—an essential part of their education that goes beyond academics. These sessions are designed to help students build key life skills, develop personal qualities, and embody our core values of Respect, Honesty, and Compassion.

In addition to character education, these lessons incorporate elements of Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE), and Health Education, offering a well-rounded approach to personal development and well-being.

This term, our focus has been on exploring each of our school values in depth. Students had the opportunity to reflect on real-life role models who exemplify Honesty, Respect, and Compassion, encouraging meaningful discussions and personal reflection.
