Re: Update to School Uniform Policy

We hope this letter finds you well. We would like to take a moment to thank you for your continued support in ensuring that our students are adhering to the school uniform policy. Your commitment has played an important part in fostering a positive learning environment for all our students.

As part of our ongoing efforts to maintain high standards of discipline and consistency, we are making a slight adjustment to our uniform policy. Starting from 17th March if a student forgets to bring an item of their uniform (such as a blazer, tie, or shoes), they will be expected to borrow the item from our uniform cupboard and they will be required to hand in their mobile phone to a member of staff for the remainder of the school day. This is intended to encourage responsibility and ensure that uniform expectations are taken seriously by all students and our items are returned. Over the past year and a half a significant amount of borrowed uniform has not been returned and this has had a large cost implication for the school.

Should a student refuse to comply with this new measure, the situation will be escalated, and further sanctions may be applied. We kindly ask that you support this policy change by ensuring that your child arrives at school fully prepared with the correct uniform each day.
