Dear Parent/Carer,

As the final week of term 5 draws to a close, I am left reflecting on how swiftly the year is passing by and how much the school has moved forward in such a short amount of time. With this in mind, I wanted to start by thanking you all for your continued support as we continue to make Montsaye Academy a place where our children can flourish; a place where we collectively celebrate individual and team achievements through our rapidly evolving character programme; and a place where quality teaching supports all of our children in aiming for excellence in all that they do.

With exams taking place in the main hall, assemblies continued in virtual format with Progress Leaders recognising individual students for their hard work this term. Normally, I give out each and every certificate in the main hall but due to exams taking place these were given out during tutor time, but I still took great pride in reading through all the nominations and seeing students receive recognition for their hard work.

Looking to Key Stage 5, seventeen of our Year 13 students have received offers from Russell Group universities which is a staggering achievement and a testament to their hard work. One student has also secured a place at Oxford University to study mathematics – the first Oxbridge student in 10 years.

The work of the student leadership team is continuing to gain momentum and now has a genuine voice in the future of the school which has been refreshing for them. They are looking at a number of projects and this week they came to pitch an idea to me around Culture Days which will be a celebration of all the different cultures within our school community. They had lots of great ideas which I am looking forward so sharing with you all.

Our fantastic sports leaders were back in action this week, this time leading a primary football event for many of our feeder schools. They helped set the event up, organised each of the matches and refereed them. A big well done to - Harry T, Harry W, Oscar J, Mason M, Sam B, Ziva V, Madelyn E and Sienna F.
