Dear Parent/Carer,

The final GCSE examinations took place for Year 11 bringing an end to what has been a hugely positive exam period for all students. Year 10 mock examinations commenced this week and it has been great to see Year 10 students approaching these important examinations with such positivity. It was also reassuring to see many students applying revision skills from the Challenge 100 task through the use of flash cards and other strategies to prepare for these examinations. It is an important opportunity for students to see how they are progressing in each of their subjects and most importantly to find out which areas they need to work on. Once the papers have all been marked, the first progress league will be published for Year 10 so that students can see where they are ranked in the year group. Year 10 have also been undertaking their English speaking and listening assessments where they each have to deliver a presentation on a topic of their choice. These presentations are recorded and Mrs Mooney (Head of English) was keen to show me
