Dear Parents/Carers,

We are about to begin the final stage of your child's GCSE journey. When they return after half term there are only 9 school weeks to go until the GCSE exam series starts. We would like to draw your attention to key aspects below that will support your child to be successful.

Year 11 'Reset'

All Y11 students will be provided with a 'reset' with regards to their attendance and behaviour points. All students will therefore return to school on Monday 26th February with 100% attendance and no behaviour points. Although this will not be reflected on Go4Schools due to the tracking system over the school year, this will be tracked internally by the Year 11 team and students will be updated regularly with regards to this.

At the end of Y11 there are various events to celebrate the end of their time here; including but not limited to, Y11 Prom and a celebration assembly. The Y11 Prom will be held on Thursday 4th July at Kettering Park Hotel. This annual event is always an incredible evening where students are able to dress up and celebrate the end of Year 11.

To be able to attend these events students will be required to have attendance of 95% in the last 9 weeks leading up to exams, meaning they are only able to be absent for two days during this short period. This then needs to be maintained during the exam period In addition students will need to ensure that they receive no more than 10 behaviour warnings. As above, this is following the 'reset' that all students will be provided with.

Please be aware that punctual attendance to school at 8.35am. Behaviour during social times and behaviour in between lessons must also meet our expectations in order to be able to attend these events. The Academy's behaviour policy will still apply.

Rewards



Students who attend these sessions will need to sign in and out in the library. They will not need to wear school uniform but should hide phones away out of sight unless teachers use them as part of sessions. The expectation is students come to these classes to work hard and behave well. Students will be sent away if they waste the time of other students and staff.

There will be a set of sessions for the Easter holiday too and I will confirm these closer to the time. We are trying to have the majority of these classes in the first week. There will be a few in the second week due to staff being on the ski trip and because of Leicestershire school holidays occupying staff with childcare needs.

Trial Examinations

From Monday 26th Feb until Monday 8th March, students will have their final set of trial examinations of Year 11. Students have already received their personalised timetable, it is vital they keep this safe and bring it to school with them daily in preparation for their exams. Their timetable will show their individual seat and length of exams, students will only be sitting exams in subjects they take.





A reminder that students should attend in full school uniform, their equipment must be in a clear pencil case (including a scientific calculator and mathematical equipment for relevant exams), and a clear water bottle. Morning exams will start promptly at 9am, with students arriving by 8.35am and registering with P1 teachers. Afternoon exams will start at 1pm. When students are not in an exam they will be attending their usual lessons.
