



What are the different year groups called?

On 24th May some middle and primary schools returned but they had to follow strict social distancing measures.

What subjects do they learn in France?

Subjects taught in France are divided into groups:

French, history, geography and civic studies such as; mathematics, science and technology; physical education and sport, arts and crafts and music.

What is redoublement?

In French schools it was common for students to have to repeat a year but the government said in 2014 that it should only be done on an exceptional bases if they feel the child will benefit from it.

What are the differences between French and English schools?

French schools don't wear a uniform which in most English schools it is compulsory.








Ex-students continue to Excel

A big shout out to all the year 9 students who attended online live sessions so far this week.


PE held two live sessions, which introduced our Year 9 students to Sports Studies and GCSE PE. Everyone is excited and looking forward to starting the course!
