Remember, if you need extra support you can... re-watch the video, email your teacher, check another source such as BBC bitesize, or message a friend.

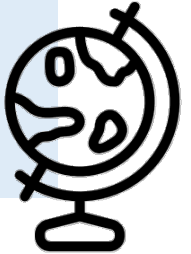

How to find Oak Lessons

1. Go to www.thenational.academy
2. Click on 'Classroom'
3. Go to either 'Find lessons', or 'Subject' at the top
4. Find the year group and subject you are looking for (Year 7, 8 and 9 lessons may be found in different year groups as we study them in a slightly different order)
5. Find the topic you are doing at the moment



What happens if a whole class or year group is working from home?

In addition to the resources listed above, please be aware that if your whole class or year group is working from home your teacher may also place work on Microsoft Teams which can be accessed through your school Office 365 account. Please make sure you check this every day, as well as your school emails.

How can GCSE students access live lessons?

For Years 10 and 11 your Geography teacher will send an invite out to join your lesson. These 'live' lessons will take place within your usual timetabled lesson time so remember to keep an eye on your school timetable to see when you would normally have Geography. Check your email for the Teams invite. Email your geography teacher if you don't receive an invite.

What other resources could help me with my Geography learning?

- If you do not have access to online learning at home, contact your Geography teacher and they will be able to provide you with some paper based learning resources.
- Each topic has a knowledge organiser with key information on it about the topic you are studying, these can be found on the school website.
