Financial Issues

Tuition Fees – currently £9000, can move up to £9250

You do not need to have this money upfront – they are mostly paid by loan, and the money goes direct from the SLC to the university.



Maintenance Loans



 These are to cover living costs, and are dependent on household income.

Loan repayments

Repayment is 9% on any earnings above the £21,000 threshold

Gross Salary	Monthly Gross salary	Monthly Repayment
Up to £21,000	Up to £1,750	£0
£22,000	£1,833	£7
£25,000	£2,083	£30
£30,000	£2,500	£67
£35,000	£2,916	£105
£40,000	£3,333	£142
£50,000	£4,166	£217

Interest Rates: RPI + up to 3%

If earnings fall below £21,000 a year, repayments are suspended.

Any outstanding balance is cleared after 30 years.




