## The Gunpowder Plot of 1605

<b>Catholic</b>	The King's Chief Minister who was a Protestant that openly disliked Catholics.
<b>Lord Mounteagle</b>	A crime committed against the King or Queen of a country. The person is known as a traitor.
<b>Houses of Parliament</b>	A member of a branch of the Christian Church whose Head is the Pope in Rome.
<b>Robert Cecil</b>	A person who is part of a conspiracy to overthrow the King.
<b>Treason</b>	The Member of Parliament who received a letter making him aware of the Gunpowder Plot.
<b>Guy Fawkes</b>	Protestant King of Scotland who came to the English throne in 1603.
<b>Plotter</b>	The Palace of Westminster in London where the government are based.
<b>James I</b>	The man responsible for collecting the gunpowder to blow up the Parliament building.
